ENERGY RATING LABEL CHANGES FOR AIR CONDITIONERS, REFRIGERATORS AND FREEZERS

Dear Chris,

All Australian jurisdictions and the New Zealand Government have agreed to revise and improve the appliance label, one of the longest running programs under the Australian National Framework for Energy Efficiency and the New Zealand National Energy Efficiency and Conservation Strategy. These programs have enabled the achievement of some substantial energy usage and carbon emission reductions.

The Equipment Energy Efficiency program, which includes Minimum Energy Performance Standards (MEPS) for equipment and appliances has contributed to this. This program includes the consumer focussed Energy Rating label.

The purpose of this letter is to advise you about some upgrades to Standards and Energy Rating Label calculations so that you are able to keep your members informed.

The aim of the Energy Rating Label is to assist consumer decision making by providing easy to read comparative data at point of sale. It also assists suppliers and retailers to differentiate product in a market where consumers are becoming increasingly environmentally savvy. Research has shown that consumers value energy ratings as a key contributor in their decision making process with 90% using information on the energy label when buying an appliance.¹

New Standards

New refrigerator and freezer standards were published in April 2009 and air-conditioning standards were released on 6 October.

As a result refrigerators and freezers will need to be registered to the new standards as from 1 October 2009 and air-conditioners from December 2009 (two months following the release of the standard).

As of 1 April 2010 all non-exempt items will need to be registered to the new standards (see time table attached). The latter will include new requirements to rate heating efficiency on air-conditioners with both cooling and heating modes.

New Labels

Industry adoption of current technology, to increase the energy efficiency of individual products, has resulted in the clustering of products at the higher end of the scale. As a result of this refrigerators, freezers and air-conditioning units have been re-graded to a new 10 star system to enable clearer differentiation.

While the appearance and dimensions of the label will be similar, the revised algorithms will initially reduce the number of stars on the label for products which have the same energy consumption. This re-grading will allow consumers to make better informed cost and energy-saving decisions, as well as providing an incentive for manufacturers to continually improve the energy efficiency of their products.

While the 6-star label will continue to appear on all products, the new 10-star label can be awarded to manufacturers of super-efficient appliances.

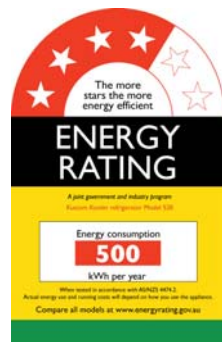

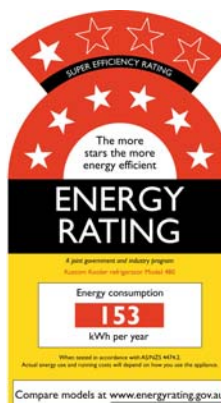

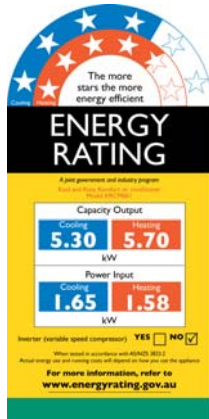


New Super Efficiency label

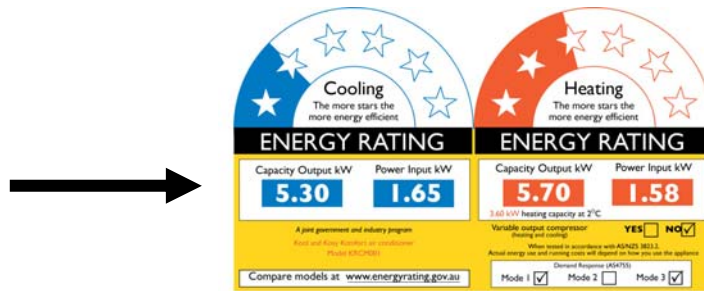


Air-conditioner labels
